**Join Fielding President Katrina Rogers, Vice President for Strategic Initiatives and Research Orlando Taylor, and our local Fielding community members to learn about the latest developments in research at Fielding.**

### **7:00-9:00 PM Alonso Center Event: The Chinese Psyche: A Group Therapist's Intimate Encounter with Otherness** – Walnut Room

***This symposium will feature a talk given by Ruthellen Josselson, followed by commentary from Stephen Ruffins and Kjell Rudestam. There will then be an open discussion with the audience.***

This talk is an effort to tell the story of how Dr. Josselson learned what it means to deeply encounter people of a very different culture in her experiences teaching group therapy in China:

*It is a story of how I was taken to be a good witch, a healer with magical powers, and how I tried to wrest myself free of this projection yet remain a good teacher. During my nine years teaching in China, both in person and online, I came to love my students and to be grateful for their leading me to discover new things about myself and what it means to have an indelibly Western mind. I also learned about what is universally human. As I worked with the people intimately in quite revealing process groups over time, I also learned a great deal about the Chinese psyche....*

## Tuesday, June 27

### 5:00 - 6:00 PM Ruthellen Josselson conversation hour and book signing

#### *Paths to Fulfillment: Women's Search for Meaning and Identity* – Magnolia C

Ruthellen Josselson will discuss her recently published book that presents results of a 35-year longitudinal study of women's identity. She will address how the identity women chose (or didn't choose) by the end of their college years affected how their lives unfolded. Because these 26 randomly-selected women came of age at a particularly tumultuous time in U.S. history, they were among the first who rode the waves of change in women's roles created by the Women's Movement. In taking on meaningful roles in the working world, they were trailblazers in creating new possibilities for women's lives. These "real" women, in contrast to the pervasive media stereotypes of the time, took on the challenge in very different ways and were able to forge uncharted lives for themselves. The book documents how women go about finding and revising themselves over time, and then how late midlife brings subtle but substantial changes in how they see the world and themselves. *Books will be available and signed at the end of the talk.*

### 7:00 - 9:00 PM Wounded Warrior Guest Speaker Ms. Jennifer Mackinday – Magnolia C

In 2005, Jennifer's brother, James Smith, suffered multiple injuries in Iraq while on a mission with his Army Stryker Combat Brigade. The event immediately plunged Jennifer into the role of caregiver for her brother – a role she was not prepared to handle. Her early attempts to guide James through the red tape of government bureaucracy, the maze of doctor appointments, and the stress of a warrior's everyday "new normal" left Jennifer frustrated and exhausted.

That all changed, she'll tell you, when she discovered Wounded Warrior Project.® Jennifer learned she wasn't alone in her journey, and that people and programs exist to help James with his needs. She'll tell you about the impact the decision to attend an air show made on her life, and she'll explain the passion that drove her to co-author the book *Friends for Life: Strangers Brought Together by the War in Iraq*. The story of her journey will comfort and inspire you.
